ADDRESSING RADICALIZATION AND EXTREMISM THAT LEAD TO TERRORISM

- ▶ Supporting Member States in addressing violent extremists rehabilitation and reintegration in prison settings
- ▶ Promoting the Rome Memorandum on Good Practices for Rehabilitation and Reintegration of Violent Extremist Offenders

MITIGATING OF RISKS POSED BY CBRN MATERIALS OF CRIMINAL, ACCIDENTAL OR NATURAL ORIGIN AT NATIONAL, REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL LEVELS (INITIATIVE AND FUNDING OF THE EUROPEAN UNION)

400 CBRN experts from 64 partner countries, EU, EU Member States, International Organizations (particularly, IAEA, OPCW, BWC ISU, Interpol, Europol, WHO, 1540 Committee)

- ▶ Reducing the fragmentation of responsibilities through the creation of a network of stakeholders working in the CBRN area at the national, regional and international level
 - ▶ Assisting countries to develop National CBRN Team to facilitate coordination and integration
 - ▶ Designing methodologies to help countries in assessing their CBRN resources and needs and come up with strategic plans
 - ▶ Fostering CBRN governance to ensure effective coordination and communication within a country
 - ▶ Monitoring and evaluating the impact of projects implemented at local and regional level
 - ▶ Addressing potential threats emerging from misuse of biotechnology advances
- Establishment of Regional Secretariats in:**
- ▶ African Atlantic Façade (Rabat, Morocco)
 - ▶ Central Asia
 - ▶ Central and Eastern Africa (Nairobi, Kenya)
 - ▶ Gulf Cooperation Council Countries (Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates)

 - ▶ South East Asia (Manila, the Philippines)

- ▶ Promoting the rights of albinos and their access to services



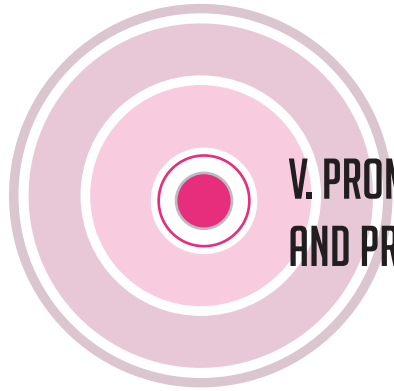

V. PROMOTING INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL LAW AND PRACTICE

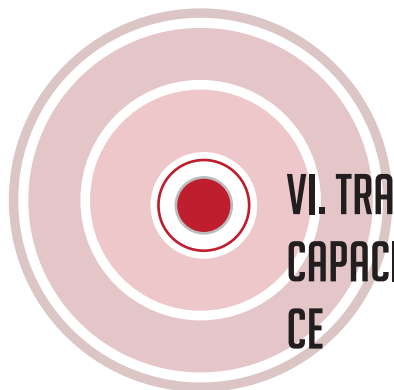
